As a BIPOC-led organization, we recognize that art and culture spaces are not always accessible or affordable, especially for BIPOC families, caregivers or children whose first language is not English, and families who live in neighborhoods with less economic resources. We look forward to sharing our resources with you to continue nurturing young children and introduce activities that center wellness of mind, body, and spirit. We're excited to continue sparking curiosity and inspire healing and joy with your family yearround.

Over the next year, you'll hear about cultural opportunities from our team and from your school or center's Cultural Liaison—also known as the parent coordinator or center director who helps you navigate the city's wide array of museums and other cultural spaces. They will connect you to our Family Pass for FREE general admission to nearly 90 NYC museums, historical societies, gardens and zoos, and offer guidance on how to find and make the most of sometimes unfamiliar spaces. Whether you decide to visit a cultural space in your neighborhood or travel to a different part of the city, you will find our Family Guide packed with tips to activate your creativity, develop your vision of wellbeing through the arts, and inspire joyful family adventures.

HOW TO USE YOUR COOL CULTURE FAMILY PASS



You + 4 = FREE

Up to 5 people, including you, will be granted free admission with a Cool Culture Family Pass to approximately 90 museums, zoos and historic sites.

More than 5 people total? Be prepared to pay additional admission fees.



Show Your ID

You may be asked to present personal identification. Museum admissions will ask only to verify that the Pass is yours. You can use the list of cultural partners in this Guide to see which museums require ID, call ahead to check, or bring an ID just in case.



It's Personalized

At least one adult in the family, present at the time of the visit, must have their last name match the one printed on the card.



Extras Are Extra

The Family Pass covers general admission. You may need to pay extra fees for special exhibits and activities. Please call the museum if you're unsure.

It's For Families

Family Passes should not be used for school trips or large group trips. Up to 3 families, each with a Family Pass, can visit a museum together as a small group.



BEFORE YOUR VISIT PACK YOUR BAG WITH:

PAPER AND PENCILS

Draw or write what you see (typically, museums and other cultural spaces only permit the use of pencils).

AN "ART" TELESCOPE

Fun tools from your home, like a magnifying glass or a decorated toilet paper roll to use as a telescope, will keep young children's hands busy and engage them in close looking.

SNACKS

Museums often have cafes but they can be costly. Call the cultural space to ask about bringing your own snacks and whether they have eating areas. If outside food is not permitted, eat your snacks right before or after your visit.

A CAMERA

Find out if photography is allowed in the museum. If so, take pictures of your child(ren) with the art (e.g. imitating a statue) and exhibits. Discuss your pictures after the trip to reinforce memories.

Haven't received your pass?

Please reach out to staff at your child's school to register. The Pass expires on Oct. 31, 2023.

EXPLORE THE MANY WAYS YOUR FAMILY CAN HAVE FUN AND SHARE KNOWLEDGE:



Follow Your Child's Lead Explore the areas that interest your child(ren) most and ask them:

- What do vou see?
- What do you wonder about what you see?
- How does your body feel being in this space?

Strike a Pose

Have everyone in the family pose like something they see. Ask your child:

- What is the character or animal doing or feeling?
- What sounds might they be making?

Imagine & Create

With your child, create stories about the objects or artwork you see. Ask vour child:

- What's happening there? What will happen next?
- What kind of objects would you add or take out if you can shape, or curate, this space?

AFTER YOUR MUSEUM VISIT

Family Memories

On your way home, while sharing a meal or at bedtime, take a moment to tell and retell the story of your visit. You can show photos of the day and ask questions like: "What was your favorite part of our visit?" and "Would you like to explore a similar or different space next time?"
